An Interview with Holley Schramski

Q. Where did you start working at UGA?

Whether it be one of the departments working on a task or project, a group tackling the implementation of a new policy, watching staff put together a creative solution for a department, or celebrating one of our team earning a new degree or certification...I enjoy seeing our collective efforts and watching each of us individually grow through those experiences.

Q. What would your team say you value the most?

A. Hard work. My parents taught me the value of hard work and the personal satisfaction in knowing you have given your best. It thrills me to see our teams accomplish goals and I see how they put everything they have into it. Many of the staff have heard me say this before: When you are at work — it is time to work...and when work is over, be proud of your accomplishment and turn your focus to family, friends, the home, and things that truly matter.

Holley has been an inspiration to work with. She is selfless in her dedication to doing what is best for Finance & Administration and UGA. I hope she continues to stick around for another 25 years!

National Hispanic Heritage Month (Sept. 15-Oct. 15)



National Hispanic Heritage Month honors the culture, heritage, and contributions of Hispanic Americans each year. The event began in 1968 when Congress deemed the week including September 15 and 16 National Hispanic Heritage Week to celebrate the contributions and achievements of the diverse cultures within the Hispanic community. The dates were chosen to commemorate two key historic events: Independence Day, honoring the formal signing of the Act of Independence for Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua (September 15, 1821), and Mexico's Independence Day, which denotes the beginning of the struggle against Spanish control (September 16, 1810).

It was not until 1988 that the event was expanded to month-long period, which includes El Dia de la Raza on October 12, which celebrates the influences of the people who came after Christopher Columbus and the multicultural, multiethnic society that evolved as a result; Chile's Independence Day on September 18 (El Dieciocho); and Belize's Independence Day on September 21.


Please note that for newsletter purposes, we are counting from the employee's actual hire date and Finance and Administration uses a different date for their recognition.
