Staff Resources Fair March 11, 2019



While students were preparing to celebrate the mid-point of the spring semester, members of the University Staff Council and Vice President for Finance & Administration's Staff Representative Group were hard at work preparing for UGA's 2nd annual Staff Resources Fair. This year's fair was held on March 11 at the Tate Center's Grand Hall. Close to 700 staff members attended.

The Resource Fair showcased more than 60 UGA units. Each participating group advertised their department's services, resources, and opportunities available to staff members. The units including Human Resources, USG Well-being, Museum of Natural History, UGA Police Services, the TAPP program, UGA Golf Course, UGA Dining Services and many more offering specialized assistance to UGA staff.
